### Prostate Cancer

In 2017 prostate cancer was the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Australia. It was also the most commonly diagnosed cancer among men..

There were 20,672 new cases of prostate cancer diagnosed in 2017.

In 2021 the number of new cases of prostate cancer was 18,110.

The following figures are estimations for 2021:

- Estimated deaths from prostate cancer—3,323 males
- This is 12% of all male deaths from cancer—27,600
- The chances for surviving prostate cancer for at least 5 years is 96%
- 55 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer each day
- 98% of men diagnosed are 50 years of age or older..

### TURP

The other prostate problem is urinary problems caused by an enlarged prostate. This causes frequent need of urination, especially at night, difficulty in urination, a feeling that your bladder is not empty, and other matters'

The answer is what is known as TURP—transurethral resection of the prostate. This is a 60 to 90 minute operation with a two day stay in hospital. There are after affects which a web check will advise.

Do have yourself checked out if you are experiencing any difficulties.

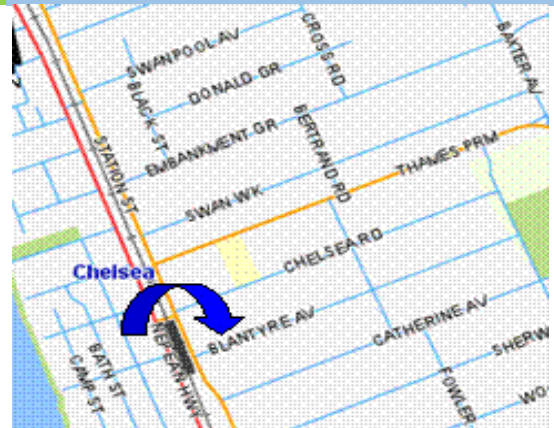
