

#### **HEALTH REPORT**

#### SAFETY

Accidents can happen anytime. You may be coming through a door and trip over a coffee table (it happened to me only a few weeks ago). You may be distracted by a noise, a movement or a bump. You can fall, be cut or break something. Take care, be aware is a good saying but awareness can lapse.

Awareness, or mindfulness, is of paramount importance to all of us in whatever environment we may be in. This is especially so where there is machinery and what is a men's shed but a workplace full of machines?

Safety is the responsibility of us all. It cannot be left to one person, or even just a few. All of us have eyes to see and tongues to speak so if we see something that could be dangerous we should speak up about it.

Current figures for the cost of work-place related injuries and illness are not yet available but in 2012-2013 there were over 500,000 cases costing an average of \$116,600 per incident. Nation-wide the total cost of all work-related injuries or illness was \$61, 800,000.

We do not want to add to these statistics. How can we prevent this?

- Housekeeping—keep the place clean. Men's sheds do make mess but that can be cleaned up
- Safe use of tools—making certain all safety procedures are adhered to, including faces masks, gloves and ear muffs
- Making certain that untrained members do not use that they are not qualified to do so.
- Removing anything that might get caught up in equipment—loose clothing, body ornaments.
- Concentrating on the job being done—avoid distractions such as talking.

We need to remember that under Worksafe Victoria <u>any shed is only one accident</u> <u>away from being closed down.</u>

The Committee is looking to become more action orientated and we have set some objectives, that we will work on to improve the way we run the Shed. These include:

- Reviewing and updating our policies and procedures
- Developing an Induction pack.
- Testing and tagging all power tools
- Introducing a maintenance register


We have been successful in being allocated the role of assisting Chelsea Rotary in running the Kingston Farmers Market. We will need volunteers for the following Saturday mornings:
