Here is where the scam began in earnest. Instead of \$299 being reimbursed an amount of \$29,900 appeared in my bank account. I have been in touch with my bank and the Fraud investigators are at work. I may get some of the money back. I have been to the Police and they have advised me to get in touch with Cybercrime.

Thanks a local IT person, I have my laptop back.

I am, naturally, very annoyed with myself. I have had some comfort from learning that there is a computer hack who is targeting the scammers and exposing their foul activities. This bloke had confessed to being the victim of a scam himself.

So far in 2022 there have been 55.904 reports of scams in Australia.

\$167, 187, 343 has been lost and this represents 11.8% of scams reported.
